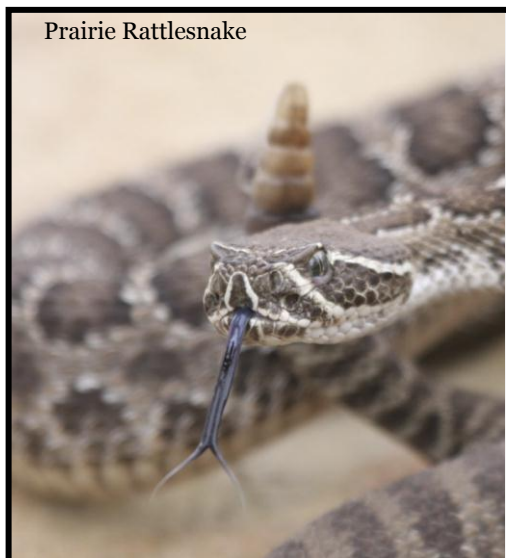


BOULDER COUNTY AUDUBON TEEN NATURALISTS



Boulder County Audubon's new teen naturalist program will offer middle and high school students the opportunity to explore many facets of the natural world and their interactions. The group will participate in wildlife surveys (birds, bats, butterflies, etc.), bioblitzes, nature photography workshops, and other outdoor activities. We've scheduled two events for this fall:

- **Winter Raptor Survey** on December 10th from 9:00am-12:00pm in northern Boulder County counting eagles, hawks, falcons, and any other raptors seen along the way. We'll map and GPS locations of observed raptors. The information we collect goes into the Boulder County Nature Association wintering raptor database, which is used to protect habitat for wintering birds of prey. - **Boulder Christmas Bird Count** on December 18th. Spend a day in the field counting wintering birds and contributing to their conservation. This 112-year-old count, initiated by National Audubon Society, contributes to the tracking and protection of birds throughout North America.
